To whom it may concern:

A properly functioning (ie no leaks) heating or AC system is what earns LEED credits. Tapes are used to seal the systems but do not earn credits as stand-alone products.

LEED requirements for VOCs refer to wet applied adhesives or sealants. Tapes have low VOC ratings because the adhesive is already dried in the manufacturing process. The adhesive portion of our tapes is 99.9+% solids. Products 488 foil, 788 foil, 491 FSK, 791 FSK, 728 ASJ (formerly product code 428), and Ideal Seal 2000 foil have all tested at <0.01% VOC per ASTM-D2369.

Ideal Tape Co. makes many tapes that may help you earn LEED certification points. When our tape products are combined with low VOC rated construction adhesives and sealants the building is eligible to receive LEED® certification credits. These credits include:

EA Credit 1 (Optimized Energy Performance)

EQ Credit 4.1 (Low Emitting Materials)
